5. PROCLAMATIONS: MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

Whereas, mental health is essential to everyone's overall health and well-being; and

Whereas, mental illness causes untold suffering for millions of individuals and families in communities across the country; and

Whereas, people with mental illness can recover and lead full, productive lives;

Whereas, untreated or under-treated medical illness costs public and private employers billions of dollars annually through absenteeism, turnover, low productivity and increasing medical costs; and

Whereas, mental health organizations are promoting emotional well-being and increasing public awareness of mental health issues; and

Whereas, it is our responsibility both as individuals and a community to support and care for those in need and help people find the mental health resources they need for themselves, family and friends;

Now, therefore the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manville hereby recommit our community to increasing awareness and understanding of mental illness and the need for appropriate and accessible services for all people with mental illnesses.

FENTANYL AWARENESS DAY: May 9th

WHEREAS, National Fentanyl Awareness Day aims to amplify nationwide efforts to increase awareness and decrease demand for fentanyl, which is a highly addictive synthetic opioid that continues to drive the overdose epidemic; and

WHEREAS, Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid that is approximately 50 times more potent than heroin and 100 times more potent than morphine; and

WHEREAS, Drug traffickers are increasingly mixing fentanyl with other drugs, and even putting it in marijuana, cocaine, etc. Many people who are overdosing and dying don't even know that they are taking fentanyl; and

WHEREAS, Fentanyl is now involved in more deaths of Americans under 50 years of age than any other causes, including heart disease, cancer, and all other accidents; and

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that in the United States, 80,816 overdose deaths involving opioids occurred in 2021, and 71,238 of those overdose deaths involved synthetic opioids such as fentanyl. Manville Police Department had 30 deployments in in 2021 (1 fatal) and 31 deployments for overdose reversals in 2022 (3 were fatal); and

WHEREAS, Only two milligrams of fentanyl is considered a potentially lethal dose; it's particularly dangerous for someone who does not have a tolerance to opioids; and

WHEREAS, Young people and families need to have a strong sense of awareness about this drug and the dangers of it, kids as young as middle school age have overdosed on fentanyl.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT I, Richard M. Onderko, Mayor of the Borough of Manville, hereby proclaim May 9th as Fentanyl Awareness Day in Manville and encourage residents to be aware and to share this information far and wide. No one is exempt from the dangers of fentanyl, and it is critical that we keep our community and loved ones safe. accessible services for all people with mental illnesses.
