Ordinance # 2023-1290

Ordinance To Exceed The Municipal Budget Appropriation Limits Providing For A 3.5% "Cap" For The 2023 Budget And To Establish A Cap Bank Pursuant To N.J.S.A 40a:4-45.14

Statement of Purpose

This purpose of this ordinance is to exceed the municipal budget appropriation limits providing for a 2.5% "cap" for the 2023 budget and to establish a cap bank pursuant to N.J.S.A 40a:4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government CAP Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of the actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of Manville Borough in the County of Somerset, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2023 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$110,432.49, in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government CAP Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated, as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of Manville Borough, in the County of Somerset, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of Manville Borough shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$386,513.72 and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for Manville Borough be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days after such adoption.

**AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE POSITION
 OF POLICE CHAPLAIN
 FOR THE MANVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT**

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 48:14-141 provides that the governing body of the Borough of Manville by Ordinance may provide for the appointment of one or more Chaplains to the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Police Chaplains serve an integral role in providing comfort to members of the Police Department as well as the public and aid in community policing; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds it in the best interest of the Borough of Manville to provide for the appointment of Police Chaplains in the Borough;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Manville as follows:

1. **POSITION CREATED.** The position of Police Chaplain for the Borough of Manville Police Department is hereby created in accordance with 40A:14-141. The position will be a volunteer position, served without remuneration or benefits. The position of Chaplain shall be under the direction of the police department and shall report to the Chief of Police.
2. **QUALIFICATIONS.** The Chaplain shall have basic training and will become a certified Police Chaplain credentialed in accordance with NJ Police Chaplain regulations.
3. **DUTIES OF POLICE CHAPLAIN.** The duties of Police Chaplain shall include, but not be limited to assisting members of the Manville Police Department with any chaplain-related duties that may be assigned by the Chief of Police.
4. **RANK AND SALARY.** Any person appointed as Chaplain shall serve in that capacity without Rank or Salary.
5. **TERM OF OFFICE.** A person appointed as Chaplain shall serve until he/she is either terminated or reappointed by the Mayor, in consultation with the Borough Administrator and the Chief of Police.
6. **APPOINTMENT.** The Chief of Police may recommend to the Mayor persons that the Chief believes meet the qualifications of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141 as well as the rules and regulations of the Borough of Manville Police Department with reference to Chaplains, if any. All applicants for the position of Chaplain shall be reviewed by the Chief of Police and Chaplain liaison to determine his/her qualifications in accordance with this Ordinance and shall make recommendations to the Mayor regarding the appointment as Chaplain. The Mayor may appoint one or more Police Chaplains in consultation with the Borough Administrator and Chief of Police, and with the advice and consent of the Borough Council.
7. **SEVERABILITY** In the event that any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this ordinance which may be given effect, and, to realize this intent, the provisions and application of this ordinance are declared to be severable.
8. **REPEALER.** Any prior Ordinance section inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.
9. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon final approval and publication in accordance with the law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manville, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the maximum rates of compensation are approved as provided in the table above effective immediately following adoption of this ordinance.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ENGAGEMENT WITH DECOTIIS LLP
FOR SEWER UTILITY LEGAL SERVICES**

WHEREAS, there exists a need for specialized legal and advisory services for examining the potential sale, bidding, evaluation, and award process governing the Borough of Manville's Sewer Utility; and

WHEREAS, DeCotiis LLP has extensive experience and proven reputation in the area of municipal utilities legal counsel and can offer qualified staff and support to meet the Borough's needs; and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount of the contract in question is \$10,500.00, sufficient funding is available and has been certified as evidenced by the Borough Finance Officer's Certification attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the agreement provides that the firm of DeCotiis LLP will be paid on an hourly basis for their services; and

WHEREAS, the designation of DeCotiis LLP as consultant is specifically designed and intended to be a temporary appointment and contract; and
