Ordinance # 2023-1302

**An Ordinance By The Borough Of Manville
Amending Ordinances #2021-1269 and 2023-1293 regarding the
Temporary Waiver of Certain Construction Permit Fees
as a Result of Damage by Tropical Storm Ida**

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the Borough of Manville to extend the waiver of Construction Permit Fees for Borough residents who suffered damage to their homes, as a result of Tropical Storm Ida; this Ordinance only waives Fees, and not relax or waive the requirement to obtain all necessary permits, inspections and approvals.

WHEREAS, flooding and storm damage occurred in the Borough of Manville from Tropical Storm Ida leaving Borough home owners with damaged electrical, plumbing, hot water, HVAC and furnace equipment in their homes; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor & Council believe it to be in the best interest of the Borough to afford victims of Tropical Storm Ida with emergency relief from the cost of some construction permit fees for repair and recovery efforts from Tropical Storm Ida; and to extend the waiver deadlines previously ordained by Ordinance #2021-1069 and #2023-1293;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor & Council Body of the Borough of Manville in the County of Somerset and the State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: Notwithstanding any other Borough Ordinances or Borough Code to the contrary, all permit fees for the period from September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024 shall be waived for applicants who were owners of flood damaged homes as of September 1, 2021, for applications at such properties for hot water heater, electrical panel, plumbing, HVAC, furnaces, or related plumbing or electrical work or repairs, shall, upon the signing and filing with the Borough Clerk of a Certification of Flood Damage by the Applicant, subject to verification by Borough staff, certifying (A) that the applicant was the owner of record of the property as of September 1, 2021, and (B) that such construction work is a result of Tropical Storm Ida damage.

SECTION 2: Any resident or applicant who has already paid a permit fee for such work due and paid between September 1, 2021 and the Effective Date of this adopted Ordinance, shall, upon the signing and filing with the Borough Clerk of a Certification of Flood Damage by the Applicant certifying that such construction work is a result of Tropical Storm Ida damage, be issued a refund for any such fees due and paid on or after September 1, 2021 and on or before June 30, 2024.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance does **NOT** relax any requirements to apply for and obtain all required construction permits, inspections and approvals; the intent of this Ordinance is only to waive the fees, and there is no relaxation or waiver of the requirement to obtain all necessary permits, inspections and approvals.

SECTION 4: All permits for matters other than hot water heater, electrical panel, plumbing, HVAC, furnaces, and related electrical work, must be obtained, and are **NOT** waived by this Ordinance, and those permit requirements shall remain in full force and effect, provided that the Fees for said permits, including fees for Zoning, Fire Safety inspections, Fire Safety, and housing inspections are also waived through June 30, 2024.

SECTION 5. The Mayor, Borough Administrator, and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to take such steps as are necessary to effectuate the purposes and intent of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: Repealer. Any prior Ordinance of the Borough of Manville, or any article, section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or other provision of any such prior Ordinance, which is inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, is hereby repealed, or temporarily repealed as applicable, to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 7: Severability. In the event that any provision of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is declared invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision so adjudged, and the

remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective; such holding shall not affect any other provision or application of this ordinance which may be given effect, and, to realize this intent, the provisions and applications of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 8: Inconsistency with other Ordinances. Should any provision of this ordinance be inconsistent with the provisions of any other prior ordinances, or shall be inconsistent with any article, section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or other provision of any prior ordinances, the inconsistent provisions of such other prior ordinances are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 9: Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective immediately after final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

SECTION 10: Termination Date. The waiver of fees as provided herein shall expire on June 30, 2024, unless such date is extended by further Resolution of the Mayor & Council.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manville, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE I – NO PARKING

Schedule I of Ordinance No. 500 is hereby amended to include the following under the stated designations:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manville, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE I – NO PARKING

Schedule I of Ordinance Nos. 1004 and 500 is hereby amended to repeal the following under the stated designations:

WHEREAS, the Borough Administrator and Human Resources Director, following consultation with representatives of the Teamster's Local No. 469 and the Borough's Policy, Planning and Personnel Committee, have determined that the work week and compensation of Ms. Kimberly Monto, Sports and Administrative Coordinator in the Recreation Dept., should be updated to reflect the terms of both Borough policy and the Labor Agreement.;

**Resolution Acknowledging the Annual Audit and Corrective Action Plan
for the Year 2022 of Manville Borough, Somerset County**

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2022 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Borough of Manville's Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have

reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations"; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of N.J.S.A. 52:27BB- 52, to wit:

A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, and in addition shall forfeit his office.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manville, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.
