I have two exciting announcements for our local area concerning our veterans. Last year in December, Manville was chosen for a Wreaths Across America convoy stop to honor our local veterans. We were one of only 3 convoy stops in the entire state. It was such an honor and a day to be remembered.

This year the convoy will be close by with a planned stop at Montgomery High School on Wednesday, December 12th. Be on the look out for our Nation's longest veterans parade beginning in Columbia Falls, Maine and ending in Washington, DC at Arlington National Cemetery. That's great news for the Township of Montgomery, one of the first Purple Heart communities in Somerset County.

Part of the mission of Wreaths Across America is to "teach" our youth about the sacrifices our military personnel make defending our freedoms and way of life.

To "remember" and "honor" our veterans who have been laid to rest is also part of the WAA mission statement. This year I am excited to announce that on Saturday, December 15th, 2018 we will be laying wreaths at Sacred Heart Cemetery located right next door on Millstone River Road in Hillsborough. This is the national Wreaths Across America day with over 1,500 cemeteries participating.

I would like to thank Father Stan of Christ the Redeemer Parish for agreeing to allow the wreath laying ceremony for our local community.

With over 1,200 veterans laid to rest in this cemetery, we are beginning a fundraising campaign to acquire the necessary number of wreaths. For every 2 wreaths purchased at \$15 each, we get one additional wreath free for using our unique group ID: NJ0130 for Central NJ WAA. **Manville's Green Team is Officially "Sustainable Manville"**

The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manville adopted Resolution 2018-93 establishing a Green Team Advisory Committee to be officially known as "Sustainable Manville". Co-Chairs Tim and Tara Kenyon have been leading the group after Borough Administrator, Andrea Bierwirth, turned the team over to resident leadership following a full year under her guidance. She will continue to be a member of the team in an advisory role. To "kick-off" this new chapter, Tim and Tara organized a day at Duke Farms where Executive Director, Michael Catania, met the group and provided an educational tour of their facilities.

Sustainable Manville recently collaborated with the NJ Water Supply Authority to bring a Rain Barrel Rebate program to Manville. The group also recently teamed with Dr. Chris Obropta and Ms. Patricia (Rector)Woods in bringing rain barrel and rain garden workshops to the Borough.

Sustainable Manville is actively seeking its first certification with its parent organization, Sustainable Jersey. Sustainable Jersey certification is a prestigious designation for municipal governments in the State of New Jersey. In order to become certified, Manville's volunteers and government leaders must be able to show they are participating in "certified actions" by providing documentary evidence in order to achieve "points" toward certification. The Bronze Certification Level requires 150 action points. The Borough recently received a \$2,000 grant from Sustainable Jersey to help the town market its program.

### Downtown Redevelopment Focus Group



The Borough of Manville is partnering with the State of New Jersey's Department of Community Affairs Local Planning Services to create a Redevelopment Plan for the Rustic Mall and surrounding business area. This plan will be developed through various research methods. A focus group meeting was held on July 23, 2018 with business owners, Borough officials, and residents of Manville. This group shared their thoughts on the existing conditions, both strengths and weaknesses, on Main Street and any desired features that they might like to see in the future. The focus group meeting allowed for a collective understanding between the Borough, business owners, and residents in what they would like to see as the town works towards improvements. With this information, the Local Planning Services team will provide the Borough with a comprehensive report on the most important factors to be placed into the Redevelopment Plan.

The next step in this process is for Local Planning Services to conduct a walk-through of the targeted area of town. The walk through will be performed by Jef Buehler, a Placemaking and Place-Based Revitalization Specialist. The working committee and Mr. Buehler will visit the businesses on Main Street and will identify the positives and negatives in Manville's redevelopment area. This is an important step in completing the Redevelopment Plan to identify a vision for the Borough's Main Street.

Whether you are a professional or amateur photographer living in Somerset County, you are invited to submit photos that showcase our vibrant communities, engaging local events such as fairs or parades, picturesque natural landscape, exquisite architecture and thriving arts and cultural resources.

The Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders, in cooperation with the Somerset County Business Partnership, invites residents to participate in the fourth annual "Show Us Somerset County Through Your Camera Lens" photo contest. The deadline for entries is 4 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 14.

"We are honored to feature images from local artists that depict Somerset County as a great place to live, work and play on our website," said Freeholder Director Patrick Scaglione. "People have submitted stunning photos in the past and we look forward to seeing how artists capture more vibrant moments this year."

The Somerset County Business Partnership is looking for images that showcase people enjoying attractions, amenities and workplaces within the county for its 2019-2020 Somerset County Destination Guide.

Photo Contest entries should reflect one of five themes:

- **Community & Events** • **Natural Environment**
- **Architecture and Urban Design** • **Arts & Culture**

Submissions must be the original work of the applicant and not previously entered in the photo contest. A panel of judges will select two winners for each theme, as well as an overall contest winner in both the professional and amateur categories. ## Manville Borough Re-Assessment Program Update

The Borough of Manville entered into an annual re-assessment program in 2017. This program considers the current real estate market and updates the assessed values of all properties in the Borough each year. Maintaining the annual program also eliminates the need for a costly full re-valuation program every 10 to 15 years. This program has been successfully implemented in several other Somerset County municipalities and has shown greater accuracy of assessments which ensures a fair and equitable distribution of taxation across the town.

A condition of the re-assessment program is the requirement by the State of New Jersey, Division of Taxation, that an inspection of every Borough property occur once every five years to confirm the details of the assessment records. This translates into a 20% requirement annually. Therefore, commencing in 2017, the Borough began inspecting properties in the areas commonly known as the Claremont and Lost Valley sections, representing the first 20%. For 2018, the Borough has hired inspectors from a professional revaluation firm, Appraisal Systems Inc., to complete the inspections of the next 20% of the properties.

Inspections have now begun throughout the neighborhood commonly known as the North Side, between Dukes Park-

way East and Brooks Boulevard. The process will continue until October and a letter will be mailed to the residents in this neighborhood to inform them of the inspections. A credentialed inspector from Appraisal Systems, Inc. will be knocking on doors for the initial inspection request. This visit will be unannounced. If no is home, a notice will left to contact Appraisal Systems, Inc.'s office to arrange a more convenient time. If you are not currently available, please schedule this appointment as soon as possible. For the protection of residents, inspectors will have identification and will not enter a house unless an adult is present.

The inspection process can be as short as a few minutes and is only intended to confirm the details of the property with the least amount of intrusion on residents. Inspections will measure the exterior of the buildings and gather information such as living space, kitchens, bathrooms, basements and overall condition. This information will be used to help determine the updated assessment of the property.

All property owners will be notified of their assessment each year by the green assessment notification post cards which are sent out every February.

## September is Suicide Prevention Month



September is suicide prevention month and the Municipal Alliance wants to bring awareness of the various risks as well as resources available to our community. Many people suffer from mental illness in silence.



Friends and family do not always understand what they might be experiencing. Let's take a moment to address stigma and how it unfortunately surrounds mental illness. Most people living with mental illness show no outward signs of distress. According to the CDC (Center for Disease Control & Prevention) suicide can be prevented. There are some risk factors that we should pay attention to if you know someone who may be at risk:

- ♦ History of previous suicide attempts
- ♦ Family history
- ♦ History of alcohol & drug abuse
- ♦ Stigma associated with mental health
- ♦ Bullying

Let's be clear that having these risk factors does not mean someone is going to hurt themselves; they are just at a higher risk factor. There are several protective factors that can help negate different stressors in one's life associated with mental illness:

- ♦ Supportive family environment
- ♦ Community support
- ♦ Safe school space
- ♦ Cultural or Religious beliefs

As a community we can all work to-

gether to prevent suicide. ## New Photography Series at Manville Library

The Somerset County Photography Club will offer a three-part series at the Manville Library this fall titled "Become a Better Photographer." All three programs are intended for anyone who takes pictures, whether with a phone camera, a point and shoot, or a full-featured SLR. The discussion will not be technical but will cover basic camera controls.



Each session will cover a unique topic. September's Photography and Visualization program encourages participants to explore unique and exciting photo opportunities around their home or while traveling. Learn how to find photo opportunities and create pictures, not just capture pretty subjects or scenes. This session is presented by Arik Gorban, a celebrated photographer whose work has won numerous competitions and has been published. Arik has been lecturing and judging photo competitions for many years.

In October, Phil Witt will present a program on Landscape Photography. Attendees will learn how to capture landscapes to make their images as inspiring as the scenes they viewed. The basic principles

of landscape photography will be taught, including examples of both successful and unsuccessful landscapes. Phil Witt is an outstanding nature photographer, past president of the Camera Naturalist Photography Club, New Jersey's only club devoted entirely to nature photography. Phil runs photography workshops for Audubon and currently serves on the NJ Audubon Board of Directors.

The series wraps up in November with a program on Photographing People. Arik Gorban will teach participants how to take better pictures of people, whether formal portraits, group shots, or informal pictures, regardless of what equipment is used or the level of the photographer. Topics covered include basic camera controls, posing individuals and groups, getting the right expressions, working with various lights conditions, positioning the subject based on the light, and understanding white balance.
